## Erin Brockovich investigating

AFTER discovering residents had not received compensation, despite the Esperance port pleading guilty to charges of causing pollution in June at the Kalgoorlie Magistrates Court, American environmental activist Erin Brockovich and an Australian legal firm have confirmed they will investigate whether Esperance residents have grounds to sue for damages over lead pollution.

Ms Brockovich, who was made famous by a film about her life, where she went to battle for victims of industrial pollution, has shown an interest in the town.

Shine Lawyer Simon Morrison said: "We do confirm that we are investigating.

"But at this stage we are only at the start of the project," he said.
